Gross Margin Tool

VegTool 1.1: A grower-friendly tool for comparing management and profitabilitu

A simple computer program has been developed to assist vegetable growers with making decisions about what to grow based on an analysis of potential income and likely operating costs.

This grower-friendly tool is being distributed to the vegetable industry by the VegBIZ project VG08021

The vegetable industry's Information and Technology Advisory Group identified a strong need for this type of project. The Project Steering Committee includes grower members Jeff McSpedden and Danny De Ieso, who have provided valuable guidance on meeting grower needs and have emphasised that for the tool to gain maximum adoption, it must be as simple and straightforward as possible.

The program allows growers to enter estimated yields, prices and input costs in familiar units, e.g. without having to convert everything into "per hectare" values, to arrive at a gross margin. Users can decide on the level of accuracy, but it is envisaged that the main use of the tool will be to conduct relatively simple comparisons of different crop production "Scenarios".

In the interest of "keeping it simple", the Steering Committee suggested that no more than 10 input cost categories be included. They are Seed & Plants, Fertiliser, Fuel, Chemicals, Water, Labour, Electricity/Gas, Packaging, Freight/Transport and Other Operating Costs.
